

## Primary School P.E. and Sport Funding for Primary Schools

The government provides additional funding to schools to improve Physical Education and Sport in schools in order to increase fitness levels and encourage healthy lifestyles. This funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on providing PE and Sports activities in schools. Funding is based on academic year rather than financial year.
